Please read the following Information carefully to ensure you are fully prepared for your interview at the Embassy. We want to make sure you have all required documents on the day of your interview to avoid any unnecessary delays. See below for a list of the required documents that you must bring with you to the Embassy (note that this is for the Principal Applicant and all dependents):

- Appointment information printed from the “Entrant Status Check” on the E-DV website;
- Confirmation page of the application form [DS-260](#);
- Documents showing that you have either a qualifying high school education OR have two years of qualifying work experience in the last five years immediately prior to application (for the principal applicant only; more information is available [online](#));
- Diversity Visa Application fee of \$330.00 USD: to be paid in cash (in dollars or euros) at the consular section on the date of interview;
- A valid passport containing at least two blank pages;
- One 5 x 5 cm (2 x 2 in) [color photograph](#) taken within the last six months (no eyeglasses);
- Completed medical forms *DS-2054, DS-3025, DS-3026, and DS-3030* (detailed instructions are included below);
- Original birth certificate;
- Original marriage certificate (if you are married); Divorce and/or death certificate(s) of any previous spouse(s);
- Evidence of any previously issued U.S. visas. If you are no longer in possession of the passport(s) containing the visas, you may advise the consular officer at the time of your interview;
- Police certificates for applicants over 16 years of age. Applicants who have lived in a foreign country for one year or more after the age of 16 must also present a police certificate from that country;
- Court certificates for applicants over 16 years of age. **If you have ever been arrested or convicted of a crime** you are required to declare it; Please bring relevant court documents;
- If you have been denied entry into or ordered removed from the United States, provide documents relating to this;
- Evidence of financial support (Form I-134).

Instructions for the Medical Exam

Name of the Applicant(s): _____

In connection with your application for an immigrant visa for the United States of America, you are required to undergo a medical examination with the U.S. Embassy’s panel physicians. All applicants, regardless of age, must undergo a general medical examination. Applicants aged 15 or older must also undertake a blood test and a chest x-ray. Any questions regarding the nature of the examination and tests should be directed to the physicians. At present, only two doctors at **American Hospital Kosova** in Pristina are authorized to perform medical exams.

You should call to schedule an appointment for a medical examination approximately ten days prior to your scheduled visa interview at the Embassy. Each applicant is responsible for scheduling and completing their medical exam before the date of their interview. As seating capacity at the clinic is limited, only the visa applicant(s) should go to the clinic. Applicants can expect to spend approximately four hours at the clinic. Medical examination results have a maximum validity of six months. If the exam has less than 6 months’ validity, the visa is limited to the life of the exam.

Applicants must bring their **passport, four 5 x 5 cm (2 x 2 in) color passport photographs**. In addition, applicants should bring **any and all medical records** and reports including immunization records, records of hospitalizations, operations, and accidents. If an applicant wears **glasses or contact lenses**, bring them to the appointment.

Recent changes to U.S. immigration law now require immigrant visa applicants to obtain certain vaccinations. Panel physicians must now verify that applicants meet the new vaccine requirement, or that it is medically inappropriate for the visa applicant to receive one or more of the listed vaccines.

Required Vaccines:

- Mumps
- Measles
- Rubella
- Polio
- Tetanus
- Diphtheria
- Pertussis
- Haemophilus Influenza Type B
- Rotavirus
- Hepatitis A
- Hepatitis B
- Meningococcal
- Varicella
- Pneumococcal
- Influenza
